We have four senior teams and are looking for some help in staffing all four of these teams. If you have a desire to be involved with the Royal Blue, give Nathan or Tye a call.





Women's update

In our Heritage Corner each month Diehard Digest will share a short story or two about some of our illustrious players from the past. Here's one from 30 years ago.

Some could say after reading last month's Heritage Corner

that we are fixated on the Valleys v Norths Grand Finals. As the year wears on, there will be some other games and people featured.

The 1990 Grand Final kicked off with the rain falling lightly but it quickly began to increase. In a similar fashion, the game started with a touch of fire as Norths hooker, Troy Evans tried to take winger Tony O'Neill's head off in the first tackle of the game.



Just a couple of tackles later, Norths seemed set to unsettle Valleys with a bit of "Argy Bargy" as Mick Veivers and George Doniger would say. It was a wild brawling to and fro with pretty much every player on the field involved.



It didn't take long after all that for Valleys to put in an attacking kick to test out Norths fullback, who made a mess of the wet, slippery ball and gifted Peter Shields with a try that he ran around under the posts for Peter Coyne to convert.



With Valleys up 6-0, Norths Brad Kelso got outside his man and raced away for 40m before passing inside. Valleys captain Billy Holmes held on after making a great cover defending tackle and was sent to the sin bin. Norths got on the board for 6-2.



Just before halftime, from 40m out, Peter Coyne put Peter Shieldsinto some space. He ran 20m and cut inside turning the ball back to Peter Coyne who ran into the gap Shields had created and raced the remaining 20m to score.



With Valleys up 10-2, they began the second half well with a David Bourke break, but Norths defended the break well and then a good interchange between Scott McKay and Ian McKenzie put Norths right back into the match down just 10-8.



With just three minutes to go, Trevor Schodel takes the field and causes chaos which gives Valleys the field position for Coyne to set up replacement Fechner for the equalising try.



After another penalty goal to Norths, their fullback Pat Cleary makes up for his first half gaffe with a good run down the left touchline to set up a try for Troy Evans. With less than 10 minutes to play, Norths were now ahead 16-10.



With just over a minute to play Peter Coyne found himself in position to kick a field goal, which he did from almost 22m out. Norths' Neil Wharton had an opportunity to equalise, but his Field Goal attempt went wide. That was 3 in a row for Valleys and a great way for Ziggy Strasser, who retired, to leave the game.
